

<u>Mumps</u>

Kia Ora, letter to inform whanau parents and caregivers

There has been an increasing amount of people catching Mumps in Waikato.

- Mumps is a serious viral illness which spreads easily through the air by breathing, coughing and sneezing and through contact with infected saliva.
- People are infectious one week prior to the symptoms occurring which is, headaches, pain in the
 jaw, fever, and swelling of the glands around the face.
- About 1 in 10 people can get meningitis, Mumps can also cause encephalitis (inflammation of the brain) nerve deafness, testicle and ovary inflammation and in rare cases can cause infertility and death.
- Mumps is a vaccine preventable illness which is prevalent worldwide. Everyone in NZ who was born
 from 1 January 1969 is eligible for free MMR vaccinations. For more information about the vaccine

If your child has mumps they should be kept home from school if unwell, and for 5 days after swelling has developed, until well again, in order to prevent the spread of the disease in the community.

It is important to see your doctor if you think that you have mumps, call them first before visiting, or call Healthling free on 0800 611 116 for health advice and information

Please ensure the school have up to date immunisation records for your children.


