Make A Nature Rainbow!

APPRECIATING NATURE, CELEBRATING AUTUMN

Autumn is full of incredible colours, and this activity lets us capture some of that beauty. Here's how to make your own Nature Rainbow using leaves and petals:

- Explore your backyard or block to find lots of different colours. Pick up leaves and petals that are already on the ground and collect them.
- Arrange the leaves and petals by colour to create a rainbow. Rainbows usually go: red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo, violet. If you can't find all the colours you can get creative!


