It has been a full and fabulous week at Waihi East School! We have been blown away by our amazing athletes who attended the Cluster Athletic event on Tuesday. Feed back from Sport Waikato, was that our tamariki displayed our values, and competed fiercely - and golly me, we have some awesome results! Seven of our children will be competing at the Northern cluster event next week. Congratulations to you all!

Our music students are all preparing for a showcase coming up in a couple of weeks, and we are enjoying their musical efforts as they prepare - something to look forward to.

Our Year 6's are preparing their end of year item and various transition programs are happening as they get ready to fly their schooling nest, out into the next stages of life - it is so exciting to see these incredible young people at this point in their journey - many of which we have had the privilege of caring for since they started school, it is certainly a bittersweet time for our staff.

You might have heard the New Zealand Curriculum is being refreshed - in reality it is being completely revamped! By 2026, the Ministry of Education expects all schools to be rolling this out in our programs. They have released the final version of Aotearoa Histories, which many schools are adopting now, and also this week the Social Sciences curriculum for schools to try. In a nutshell, it has moved to an understand, know and do type of learning. There appears to be some great concepts in here, and we look forward to trying these out over time. I suspect there will be the odd kink or two to iron out, as we work out what is best for us.

The children waiting for help, in learning, behaviour and or life, is a long long list, and takes far too long to be able to implement initiatives to help. We desperately need play therapists, councilors, trauma informed practitioners, physios, occupational therapists, more money for teacher aides, and the list goes on. Please support our teaching whanau as we continue to do the absolute best we can with ridiculously limited resources.

Next week Beach Hop is in town! As a school we will be viewing the cars as they come into town along Kenny Street (weather permitting), and our Kapahaka will be opening the festivities! If you wish to take your child to town to visit this cars and enjoy the atmosphere as a whanau, please sign them out at the office and let their class teacher know.

## Public Notice advertising details of pre-enrolment procedures and subsequent balloting Procedures.

Enrolment at our school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office.

Applications for out-of-zone places are now being invited for those students who will become eligible for enrolment during the period for Term 4 2022 and Term 1 2023 (This includes students applying to be treated as in-zone students under transition provisions).

The deadline for receipt of application for places is 19th November 2022.

If a ballot for out-of-zone places is required, it will be held on 20th November 2022. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.

If you live in the home zone and have not yet signaled your intention to enroll your child later this year or next year, please contact he school immediately to assist us to plan appropriately.








#### **GALA RAFFLES**














# **BAGs** for

For every 10KGs of paper supermarket bag s we supply, they will donate to us 10KG of yummy, healthy fruit to share amongst our students.






