We do not have enough spare uniforms to reclothe students who are playing in the rain storms on purpose. * Please remind your child/ren that rough play, playfighting, pretend hitting or play hitting with mates, is not ok at school. Whilst it is a natural and engaging thing for some students (to playfight), it too often leads to students getting hurt, loosing their temper or feeling offended when it gets too rough. * We have many students walking to sports in the afternoons, please remind them to stay on footpaths (do not walk on the roadside), stay safe when crossing (look, listen and WALK) at a place you have told them is a safe place to cross. Watch for sneaky driveways (cars backing out of driveways).

As we start planning for term three (ALREADY!), we will be running senior school electives again. If you have any projects, talents or skills you would like to share with a small group of year 4-6 students please contact Mrs Coll to have a chat and get more information.








COUNCIL PARKING NOTICE
