With the work that staff have done in professional learning around writing, we are already seeing exciting movement in writing progress across the classes. We are on track to meet the targets set out in our 2019 Charter and Annual Plan.

Next week we welcome the Education Review Office (ERO) to our school, who will be taking a few days to dig into what we do here, our learning, our systems, our achievements and where we are heading as a school. We have many celebrations and achievements to share with them as well as improvement plans for us to continue moving forward. As part of the process, we invite parents and whanau down to have a meeting with them. If you would like to attend, please come down to school next Tuesday 2nd July at 2.10pm for an early afternoon tea and a chat with our guests.

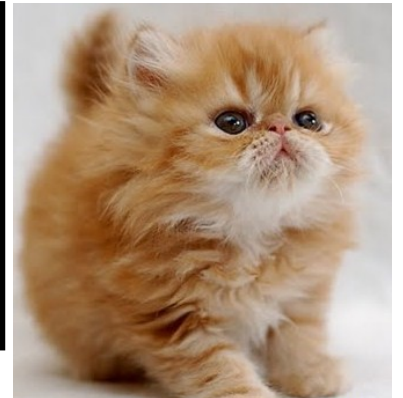


LOST

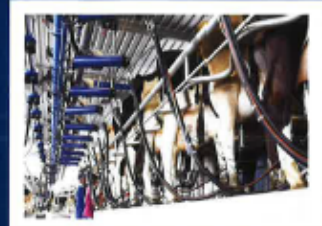

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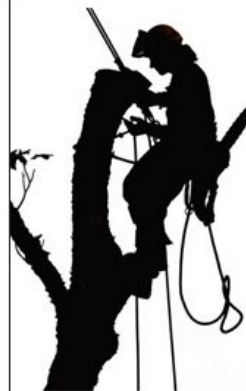
