Kia ora Whanau,

As the end of Week 3 draws to a close, I would like to encourage you all in the good work you are doing raising wee humans. This isn't an easy task, and it's a pretty thankless one too - but be encouraged, we do see you (parents), we support you and are cheering you on! There are some opportunities coming up to catch up with your child's teacher, if you would like to do this, please contact them via email to book in a time that works for you both. We take being a part of our village seriously, and the more we can do together for your little (or bigger) one, the better.

You might have heard in the media that the Teacher and Principal NZEI (union) claims have been counter offered, and many of the conditions we have asked to be addressed have been taken off the table for the first round of negotiations. Some of these conditions affect our tamariki, your children, hugely. Things like reduced class sizes, access to funding for teacher aides, access to counselling at school for our babies, some of who desperately need it (and whanau want this for them), teacher release time, to plan and craft meaningful lessons for their classes, and access to support for many of our children, who need this for all kinds of neurodiverse reasons, access to faster support for learning, and the experts to help with this.

If the opportunity comes along for you to share your support for teachers, and the important work we are doing (helping shape the next generation is sure up there in terms of importance!), please share this. Across New Zealand, we are encouraging all people to support our Teachers, our profession is attracting less people, with many deciding the conditions are not for them, and we desperately need good, strong, kind, and able superheroes, to walk alongside our babies.

On another note, you might have seen our two fundraisers coming up to help support some of the things mentioned above. We have the School Colour Fun Run on the 2nd of December, and whanau are welcome to come along for the fun and join in! More coming on this later.

On the 25th of November, we have a very exciting Twilight Gala! Massive thanks to Vicki L and Emma V for spearheading this for us - we are super grateful and super excited! Come along and bring all your friends, there will be pony rides, good food, quick fire raffles and so much more!

Public Notice advertising details of pre-enrolment procedures and subsequent balloting Procedures.

Enrolment at our school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office.

WHERE ?

We meet at the Salvation Army Hall, Seddon Street.

We may plan trips to other places in the region and we may also have camps, games and cluster events throughout the year.

WHEN ?

We meet every first Friday and third Friday during term time. The start time is 3:30pm and we finish at 5pm.

WHY ?

Youth need safe spaces where they can meet, be mentored, have fun, be encouraged, and develop social and relational skills, while figuring out who they are - it's a vital part of being healthy!

We use E Tū Tāngata values to tackle "Tall Poppy Syndrome" which is an issue in Aotearoa New Zealand and impacts



many children.
