WAIHI EAST SCHOOL AG DAY BAKE SALE Bake your sweetest treats


Bake your sweetest treats for our AG Day bake sale on Thursday 12th October. All proceeds will be going towards school resources.

also need soil or sand, ornaments, small stones, flowers etc to go along with your theme.
