Kia Ora Koutou,

Winter is here - oh my! Love the chilly mornings and warm afternoons! Don't love the amount of clothes tāmariki disrobe and drop. We are encouraging them to put their belongings away, straight away, which happens some of the time - if you could also remind them, that would be wonderful!

Our term is might be coming to a close, but our learning continues - I am continually impressed by our tāmariki, their curiosity and interest in the world around them, and the way the embrace new concepts and give things a go.

You may have heard in the news, that the Primary Teachers have accepted the latest offer from the government. This is great news for us all. I am very mindful of the disturbance union action has had, and really appreciate your support. Principal negotiations continue. Some of the relativities of the job, really do need to be addressed. Some of you may be aware, I sit on the National Leadership Group, for Principals in Aotearoa. There are 24 of us, from around the country, working in a voluntary/elected capacity, as advocates for all Principals as we work through this. I attended a Crisis Summit earlier in the week. The first of its kind in history. We had Minister Tinetti and the Secretary of Education attend, along with other peak body representatives attend. Here is an exert from the day, and some of the mahi (work) we achieved:

- 1. Principals can work together to stop education being a political football. This means all principals and boards talking with all MPs about supporting and trusting the profession to shape and lead education in our schools and kura.
- 2. We need to make sure being a principal is something that more teachers aspire to be. This will be done by sharing positive messages about what is great about the job while also working to address the systemic issues that make the role so challenging.
- 3. The current salary arrangements are no longer fit for purpose and need a significant overhaul. This is going to take careful development work!
- 4. Principals will continue to work together to hold the Government to task with the Ministerial Advisory Group about staffing so we get results that make a meaningful difference to schools and kura.
- 5. There are a range of ways that schools and principals could be better supported. This includes how the leadership advisers are deployed, development and support for boards, significant improvements to learning support and access to effective specialist support in a variety of areas, not to mention changes to sabbaticals! This will take changes to infrastructure and resourcing that we can collectively work towards with the Ministry.

The Principals' Council will continue to process all the ideas generated and will bring something more detailed to the sector as soon as possible.

I am curious about where this will all lead. Its exciting work to be a part of, albeit frustrating. If you have any questions or want to know what you might do to help - please email me, I'd love to hear from you.

Next week, our Keeping Ourselves Safe, learning starts, across the school. At 2:15pm on Monday, Constable Brian will be in the staffroom, to chat about what this learning will look like, and what some of the questions your child may come to ask might be.

MAKE YOUR BAGS GO ANOTHER ROUND






We have teamed up with Beach Road Garden Centre to help recycle packaging bags in return for Free Fruit


