

You can use the text below to help advertise open reviews.

All reviewers

- 1. Visit the website https://waihieast.schooldocs.co.nz/1893.htm
- Enter the username (waihieast) and password (eastpolicy).
- Follow the link to the relevant policy as listed.
- Read the policy.
- Click the Start your review button at the top right-hand corner of the page.
- Select the reviewer type.
- Enter your name (optional).
- 8. Follow the prompts to show that you've read the topic and enter your feedback if you'd like to comment.
- 9. Agree to the privacy statement and click "Submit review".

If you don't have internet access, school office staff can provide you with printed copies of the policy and a review form.
