Kia ora tatou! Welcome back to another exciting year, there is a lot happening and plenty to share! I hope you enjoyed some down time with your whānau over the last few months. It is wonderful to see all the students back, refreshed and roaring to go!

Our recent Mihi whakatau had over 30 new families welcomed and was again a special occasion for all involved.

Goal setting discussions

These are an incredible way to start the year. We received a lot of positive feedback about this opportunity and to have over 75% of whānau attend is a real success, we hope this helps set 2026 up for success for you and your child. PLEASE do remember that you are welcome to come and discuss learning anytime, staff would be very more than happy to work more with you.

Bike track

I am sure you will have noticed our new bike track by now, students have been testing the bikes out over the last week, there have been a few spills and scrapes, but all part of the learning process. A huge shout out to Jarred and Christiarnie from Kingsford construction who have looked after us and prepared the track ready in time for school to return, another amazing asset to help keep our students physically active and also engaged at break times. I also want to acknowledge Bikes in Schools and Sport Waikato who have helped fund a large part of the track and bikes. We have 55 new bikes, ranging from balance bikes and trainer wheels to adult mountain bikes, something for everyone! We do potentially need another container now so if you are getting rid of one, sing out :-)

We will officially open the track next Thursday night at our official opening and whānau fun evening.

Te Wahi O Rangimarie “a peaceful place”

This amazing space has opened for the year and is now fully staffed with Kim Parker working here across 2026. This space functions as a library but also allows students to visit to develop connection and build relationships- playing games, doing puzzles, making lego etc, it also provides an opportunity for students to regulate, or calm if needed. A nice quiet sanctuary as needed.

E Tū Tāngata/School values

We begun our year with professional learning around the E Tū Tāngata way of being. For those not familiar, I encourage you to check out their website- etutangata.nz

This aims to build positivity and tackle the issue we have in this country around Tall Poppy syndrome, essentially where we can be reluctant to build others up because of the perceived impact it has on ourselves. E Tū Tāngata is research based, backed by a huge number of high profile NZ sports people and celebrities. It has 3 key pillars “You have value” “Others matter” and “We succeed together”. We have begun developing actions to weave our school values through this and staff are very excited. New Zealand has the worst suicide rates in the developed world, a statistic that is completely unacceptable, many schools are onboarding E Tū Tāngata as a way of helping to tackle these statistics and in many cases, there have been successes. Watch this space!

Strategic plan

Attendance

The government has placed a huge emphasis on attendance in schools. All schools are required to have an attendance management plan for 2026, this also needs to be on our website. The number of students attending Waihi East school regularly is around 65% (differs each term) The government goal is 80%. Our goal is 80%. Enrolment Zone

We are holding a ballot, mid way through each term where we will assess places.

Following the government initiative we won't be asking for school donations again this year.

PARKING AND ROAD CROSSING

Lots of us are getting back into school and the routine and rhythm of this - this is a timely reminder to please help us keep our kids safe. Please don't park in the middle of the road and beckon your child to get in the car, or cross in random places...lots of our little ones are watching and learning how to use the crossing properly.

NP means No Parking. Please do not park in any **NP** zones around the school. Often we are expecting deliveries or rubbish pick up and need the space kept clear. Please **DO NOT** park in the staff carpark as this creates dangers for kids walking along the footpath after school. Also Please stay out of the Bus bay as the bus comes earlier this year. Thanks for your cooperation in this matter.

PB4L

Our school is proud to be part of the nationwide PB4L initiative. PB4L stands for Positive Behaviour for Learning and encompasses a pro-active, information driven and restorative approach designed to uphold whanau values.

PUPIL ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

So there are no doubts as to a child's whereabouts, parents are asked to inform the school whenever their child is going to be absent. If your child is away for several days it is only necessary to let the school know on the first day of absence. It is still appropriate to send a note of explanation or make contact with the teacher after a lengthy absence. On the first day of absence the school can be notified in either of the following ways:

- 1) by using the HERO parent app.
- 2) by telephoning - 863 8693
- 3) by sending a note to the office via another child.

Sharon or another staff member will take the message and note it on a form that is circulated to all classes by 9.30am each day.

Note: It is a legal requirement for schools to be advised of children's absences. If no contact is made, your child is marked as truant.

UNIFORM

Please name ALL uniform, togs, towels, shoes, drink bottles and lunch boxes for ease of returning items to the correct student. Thanks.☺

HATS

Children need to wear school uniform hats when outside in Terms 1 & 4. These are available from the office and are \$10.50 each. The hats are kept at school but sent home at the end of term for cleaning. No hat, means the child does not go out in the sun at morning tea and lunchtime. No other hats are allowed at school.

INFORMATION ON YOUR CHILDREN

The school keeps certain information on your children and it is most important that we are updated if any of the following details change: Phone no's, address, email, doctor, medical problems, change of caregivers, emergency contact (which we use if we cannot get anyone at home). Please email the office with any changes.

PAYMENTS

We realise that money can be a wee bit tight at this time of year. Auto payments for part amounts can be set up to pay off any fees. Our bank account number for all payments is 020472 0084492-00. Eft-pos is also available.

UP AND COMING EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Most students are going to be attending some form of extra curricular activity in the coming weeks. E.g. camp. Please make sure you have paid your contribution for these as soon as possible or contacted the office to let us know how you will pay. Part payments every week are a good idea. As you will be aware the government DOES NOT fund at high enough levels to cover all the costs of extra curricular activities. However as a school we do budget and fundraise to subsidise most excursions and trips. This does mean we ask parents for a contribution towards the activities. We are aware that this is an expensive time of year for everyone right on the back of Christmas and summer holidaying, however we love to see all students taking part, so if you are having trouble making ends meet, please contact us at school so we can make arrangements.

HEALTH MATTERS AND ALLERGIES

Parents are asked to write a note or speak with the child's teacher if there are health matters or allergies such as bee stings that may seriously affect your child. Wherever necessary, medication, named and with full instructions affixed, will be kept in the locked medical cupboard at school. The school needs a medication consent form for any child that staff may have to administer medication to. If your child is one of these, see Sharon in the office. Parents of children who have grommets in their ears or who have ear infection problems are asked to discuss problems associated with swimming with the teacher. In such cases tight fitting bathing caps can be a partial solution. [Any wounds should be covered for swimming].

SUSHI LUNCHES

We have sushi bought lunch available every week on Fridays only. 4 pieces of sushi for \$6.00. Order forms are available at the office.

SUBWAY LUNCHES

We now have Subway lunches on Wednesdays only. Please order your subway lunch online at Subwaylunches.co.nz before 9am on Wednesday morning.

UNIFORMS

At Waihi East our expectation is school uniform is to be worn. Clothing may be supplied if your child is often out of uniform. Remember our bottoms are to be **plain black, navy or denim**, minimum of mid thigh in length.
